Weekly Summary

California Weekly Summary Comments:

Humans:

A 40-year-old female resident of San Bernardino County became the first person in California infected with West Nile virus (WNV) in 2004. She experienced fever, headache, and body aches on May 17. By May 19, she had developed a non-pruritic rash on her trunk and extremities. She also noted weakness and fatigue. She was seen as an outpatient on May 23 and again on May 26 at which time blood was drawn for WNV testing. A WNV screening test was positive at the referring facility and the specimen was forwarded to DHS Viral and Rickettsial Disease Laboratory (VRDL) where PRNT tests confirmed WNV. The patient has since recovered except for complaints of a residual headache and fatigue.

Dead Birds:

The hotline received 1442 reported dead birds last week (YTD = 8806). In the last week's bulletin, The UC Davis Center for Vectorborne Diseases (CVEC) reported 75 dead birds tested positive for WNV from Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties. Positive bird species included 67 American crows, two common ravens, two mallard ducks, one western tanager, one mockingbird, one western scrub jay, and one red-tailed hawk. Of interest to note are (1) the ducks in Riverside County represent the first positive dead birds from the desert areas of California and they were collected from the center of a highly populated area in the Palm Springs area; (2) the western scrub jay in Rancho Palo Verdes is along the coast, and is the first bird reported positive from coastal Los Angeles, just south of LAX airport; and (3) the red-tailed hawk in Redlands is the first positive raptor reported this year.

The positive birds were collected in a total of 34 cities within the counties of Orange (3), San Bernardino (37), Los Angeles (25), and Riverside (10). A total of 98 dead birds were tested that week from Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Riverside and Orange counties. Thus 77% (75/98) of the birds tested from these four counties were WNV positive. Thirty-one bird carcasses from other regions of California tested negative.

News Flash:

CVEC reported 111 dead American crows have tested positive for WNV via RT-PCR from San Bernardino (59), Los Angeles (43), and Riverside (9) on June 10. A total of 143 bird carcasses were tested from these three counties accounting for 77.6% positive results (111/143). Twenty-three bird carcasses from 15 other counties tested negative. The complete list will be published in next week bulletin.

Mosquito Pools:

CVEC reported five mosquito pools (four *Culex quinquefasciatus*; one *Cx. tarsalis*) collected on 5/24 and 5/26 from sites in Los Angeles County and seven pools (three *Cx. quinquefasciatus*; three *Cx. stigmatosoma*; one *Cx. tarsalis*) collected on 5/25 and 5/26 from sites in San Bernardino County tested positive for WNV. A noteworthy item to point out is that this is the first WNV positive reporting of *Culex stigmatosoma* species.

All of the equine and chicken samples tested negative for arboviruses this week.

National Comments:

As of June 8, 2004, West Nile Virus (WNV) activity has been detected in 20 states, with Indiana and Missouri reporting their first activity this week. New Mexico announced the first human case on Wednesday, May 26th. Arizona has since reported six human cases. California and South Dakota announced their first human cases this week.

Dead Birds:

Dead bird kidney tissues are tested at CVEC using the PCR Taqman assay, subsequent to carcass necropsy at the California Animal Health and Food Safety (CAHFS) Laboratories. Organ pools from PCR positive carcasses are tested using cell culture for virus isolation. The WNV Dead Bird Surveillance Coordinator, Ryan Carney, can be reached directly at (510) 412-6251.

Sentinel Chickens:

Dried blood spot specimens from sentinel chickens submitted each week to the DHS Viral and Rickettsial Disease Laboratory (VRDL) are tested for the presence of antibodies to West Nile virus (WNV), western equine encephalomyelitis (WEE), and St. Louis encephalitis (SLE) viruses by EIA and IFA. The VRDL performs additional testing (including Plaque Reduction Neutralization (PRNT) and IgM Capture – Enzyme Linked Immunosorbent Assay (MAC-ELISA)) on specimens from sentinel chickens in which antibodies are detected in new geographic areas. The VRDL also forwards selected serum to the UC Davis Center for Vectorborne Diseases (CVEC) for additional testing for WNV, WEE, and SLE antibodies as needed.

Mosquito Pools:

All mosquito pools are screened for WEE, SLE, and WNV viral RNA using a Taqman multiplex RT-PCR. All species except Culex *tarsalis* are also tested for California Encephalitis via EIA. All positive pools are confirmed by both singleplex RT-PCR as well as *in situ* EIA.
